Spirit of NADA We Are Enough. I Am Enough.

NADA founder, Michael Smith, stays in touch with many people he has met over the years in his work as "midwife to the soul." One of them recently wrote him about her experiences with NADA. She wishes to remain anonymous.

Being with NADA has been a wonderful learning experience. I had a really rough time back in 2010, struggling with things like my self-worth, the resurfacing of past issues and the overwhelming hatred I had toward myself. The NADA protocol has been instrumental in helping me get out of that cesspit – that and my friends who had stood by me. Eventually I learned not to give in to the pain and the darkness that seemed to haunt me. A few months later, the opportunity to learn the protocol came up, and I've been with NADA ever since.

I admit back then that I wasn't very much aware of how the protocol had affected me. I've had a hard time comprehending things, feeling and understanding them as they were. When I learned the NADA protocol, I discovered a new way – a new tool – to be able to help people, and, as I found out later, a way to also help myself – in the here and now.

It took me a long time before I understood that giving ear acu treatments was also a form of education, and a way to also help myself.

In every place that we went to, there was so much to learn from the people there. Like in this community that had experienced the destructive force of a typhoon, I learned about the strength of the human spirit in the face of adversity. People who could still laugh and be kind even though they had lost their homes, their families, the life

Family Midwives in Germany Use NADA With Refugees by Natascha Neben

My name is Natascha and I am part of a family team with a social worker, two midwives and a nurse in Hamburg, Germany. We often work with refugees from around the world who are living in an environment which is overcrowded, and where addiction,

mental health problems, poverty and violence are overwhelming. Our focus is on pregnant woman and families with children from newborns to 3-year-olds.

Ralph Raben, the leader of NADA Germany and our trainer, gave us the safety to give beads to infants and needles or beads to the women even when they are pregnant. (See his story in November 2014 Guidepoints.)

We use magnetic beads on the baby from the first time we see them. Often in the first week of the child's life, we can see that they are more relaxed and have less symptoms like screaming, sweating, fever and shivering because of the beads. The parents can handle them easier, and this is a wonderful base for building the parent-child relationship. To give the beginning of life a good start – and to offer young moms and dads the feeling that they can become wonderful parents – is great.

We used the beads with one young boy of 22 months who now comes to us each week and asks for the beads. His mother said that she can see the difference in his face and in how he acts with her.

In the work with refugees, we have noticed more MIDWIVES continues on p. 10

Who can be trained?

Addiction and Behavioral Health Professionals: If you work in the addiction treatment, behavioral health or disaster response fields as a counselor, social worker, nurse, corrections officer, psychologist, medical doctor, case manager, mentor, etc., you may be able to add acudetox to your skill base. Many states have specialized exemptions that allow non-acupuncture professionals to learn and utilize the ear acupuncture protocol. NADA has documented the following states and Canadian provinces as allowing some type of ADS practice: Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Georgia, Indiana, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Missouri, New Mexico, New York, Ohio, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, Native American reservations, Nova Scotia, Ontario and Prince Edward Island. Check your state laws and regulations for more specific information as each state and province is different.

<u>Ohio</u>: Only registered nurses, physicians and acupuncturists are eligible to practice the NADA protocol.


Licensed Acupuncturists: Join in the exciting integration of Chinese medicine within a traditional Western addiction and behavioral health setting. Become an advocate for the NADA protocol in the treatment of addiction, mental health and trauma.

Training Schedule

Trainees participate in a 5-day intensive training that begins on Sunday 9/27 and ends on Thursday 10/1, followed by the 2-day conference. The training interweaves the theory and application of acudetox along with a clinical practicum. Hands-on experience is available by providing acudetox treatments to each other as well as to clients served by local programs. Trainees are required to participate in both days of the conference to earn a certificate of completion at the end of the 2nd day of the conference (Saturday, October 3).

Travel and Accommodations

Accommodations will be available at the InterContinental Cleveland for \$139/night, or at a hotel of your own choosing. Trainees are responsible for transportation, lodging and food throughout the training period, although there may be organized carpooling to and from the training site each day. they had known before. And in a rehab facility, I learned more about openness and trust that were apparent in the way it was run, in the way the boys and girls related with each other and with us. They seemed to share their experiences with no attempts to deceive or to lie, just saying things as they were.

In settings like the prison or detention camp or in the areas set aside for community clinics, the lessons are just as varied and just as strong. The people don't have to talk about these things; it shows in their actions during or after – especially after – the treatment.

And always, always, I'm humbled by the strength of their spirit, and by the bits of wisdom they share with us. One of the things that had stuck with me during the NADA training was how we are enough, just as we are, and that the needles don't make us better, but that they assist us in regaining our potential that may have been lost due to a disaster, illness or trauma. This I saw in every place I went to. We are enough. I am enough.

I learned along the way the importance of listening and of mutual trust. Listening to the peoples' words, yes, but also being attentive to their nonverbal cues, to how they responded, how they reacted. I think that's one of the surest ways to earn a person's trust. I believe that only when one is open to the possibilities can one fully enjoy the benefits of the treatment.

This goes both ways (and yes, I am ashamed that it had taken me a while to learn this) because the person must trust you and you must trust them as well. The most wonderful things can come out of this open bridge that you have set up between yourself and the patient.

I also realized how important it is to let nature run its course. It's an extension of the trust, I think. You don't try to pre-empt the effects, you just advise them to listen to their bodies. The body knows what it needs. It's a form of letting go, as was mentioned in Dr. Michael Smith's article, Spirituality and the Serenity Prayer. [*This essay is published in Nature of Qi, 2nd ed.*]

This article appeared to me just when I needed it. When I got to the part where it said that your body forgives you and it has been forgiving you for 20 years, I cried. It still makes me cry thinking about it. I used to cut myself because I had all this pain inside me and I wanted to see it manifest physically. But one day, I realized that my body hadn't done anything wrong to me. That it was trying its best to keep me alive, and so there was no reason that I should hurt it, no reason that I should punish it. So I

stopped cutting myself.

The other night, a friend asked me if I could give her an acu treatment that night. She just had a terrible day. This is the same friend who I have been giving treatments to on and off for the past two years, and the one who I had been worried about because there were times when she seemed to be teetering over the edge. It used to be that when we had problems, we would resort to drinking to blur the pain, and it was a pleasant surprise that now she chose instead to have a treatment.

I am so grateful that I have learned NADA because I can be of some help to the people I care about. I can see it for myself how this was helping her, and I guess the very fact that she asks for it again and again says a lot. And the morning after, she told me that she felt good upon waking up, and, to my surprise so did I, even if I didn't get the treatment myself. It was like in giving her ear acupuncture, its effect also extended to me, and it kind of summarizes what NADA has been to me.

I have learned – and I am continuing to learn – a lot about people, about life because of NADA. And seeing the way that people live their lives in service to others, helping them help themselves, it's already a magnificent lesson in itself.

Sublime, I daresay. 🤛

cooperation due to the NADA protocol. This is great because we work with women from all over who are victims of trauma. Before we had NADA acupuncture, there was more fear and nervousness among the mothers every Monday morning. Now we have a nice breakfast meeting, and anyone who would like to have needles or beads gets them. People sit in the group with or without needles. Sometimes husbands are with them and, of course, their children are there.

Patients mostly say that after the acupuncture they are more relaxed and they sleep better. There is less circling of thoughts and less feeling distressed. One woman who suffers from depression told us that she is sleeping better and is more friendly with her baby.

I'm really glad that I can use this wonderful easy practice of the NADA acupuncture each week with my family team and also when we visit the families in their homes. I wish that more midwives can use it for their clients.



Remembering Robert "Bob" Olander: "A Public Health Genius" by Pat Culliton

Bob Olander, a leading participant in the research and clinical implementation of acupuncture for addictions and mental health, has passed away. He was the former director of adult services for Hennepin County, Minnesota. He died in early April after a short battle with cancer. He left behind his wife and daughter – and thousands of people he touched with his daring and innovative programming in addiction treatment.

"Bob is the person who made the famous 'Bullock studies' of the '80s come to fruition," said Pat Culliton, a co-author of those studies. Culliton remembers: "After months of being told, no thanks, by almost every addiction program in Minnesota, Bob said 'let me get this straight, you insert needles in peoples' ears and it lessens their detox symptoms and potentially affects relapse? Well, I don't care if you put peppermint sticks in their ears. If it is safe and it alleviates suffering, let's give this a try."

He went on to fund and co-author several studies on the use of acupuncture in the treatment of chronic alcoholism and cocaine use and implemented acudetox services in over 50 treatment programs in Minnesota. In 1983, the Hennepin Medical Society tried to discontinue the research on the ear acupuncture. It was Bob's strength and commitment that overcame that attempt allowing the research to continue. After the first of the studies was published, many acupuncture adherents across the country were able to use that data to establish clinical programs.

"I knew Bob at Pilot City when he was on the other side of service delivery. He made an amazing accomplishment to move himself forward, and he never forgot to be client-centered. He is greatly missed for his focus and courage," wrote Sy Gross, senior clinical psychologist at Hennepin County Mental Health Center.

Bob did not limit his innovative spirit to NADA. He developed some of the first gender- and ethnic-specific addiction treatment programming in the United States which has been used nationally and internationally.

When Bob retired, the Governor of Minnesota declared "Bob Olander Day" and hundreds of people turned out to celebrate the impact he had on their lives. Ellen Benavides, former assistant commissioner for the Minnesota Department of Health, wrote in his obituary's guestbook: "He made space for so many people in so many sectors to use common sense and 'magic' to make the world a better place. Our world just lost a brightly burning light and beacon for social justice!" •
